


Copyright Reminders ©

- Including copyrighted text or media, with appropriate attribution, in your PPT for a lecture is ok
- If your lecture is videotaped, broadcast, or posted to a open Web site, you should get permission
 - Ask the creator, ask the publisher – may be fees involved
- All government work is not public domain
- All saved work is automatically copyrighted, the © symbol need not be posted
- Institutions do get sued for copyright infringement
- Most academic libraries can advise you about basic copyright questions
- Your legal department will also advise you

Copyright Considerations ©


- All use is not Fair Use

The four factors that should be considered to determine a fair use (as stated in the Copyright Act of 1976, 17 U.S.C. § 107) are:

- the purpose and character of the use, including whether such use is of a commercial nature or is for nonprofit educational purposes;
- the nature of the copyrighted work;
- the amount and substantiality of the portion used in relation to the copyrighted work as a whole; and
- the effect of the use upon the potential market for or value of the copyrighted work.

RSS for Current Awareness

- What is an RSS feed?
- RSS stands for "Really Simple Syndication"
- Format for distributing and gathering content from sources across the Web
- "Subscribe" to timely updates from favorite web sources (database searches, journal ToC, news, programs)

RSS Readers


- Choose a reader to capture your "subscriptions"
- Google or Google Reader
 - Must register for a free Google account
 - Use NOVEL Google page to practice
 - novel2008@gmail.com / pwd: NANOS2009
- My Yahoo
 - Must register for a free Yahoo account
- Firefox – Creates tab in link menu of your browser
- Internet Explorer 7 – RSS button on toolbar, saves to Favorites

What is EndNote?

- A tool for recording, organizing and utilizing bibliographic citations (references)
- Used to generate bibliographies

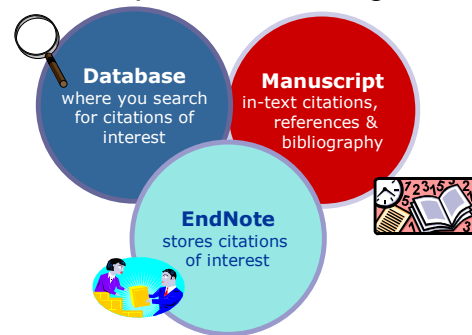
EndNote allows you to . . .

- Search online sources
- Build a Library of references
- Manage references
- Link to PDF files
- Format bibliographies instantly
 - 3000 plus output styles

Essentially you are . . .

- Creating a personal literature database
- To organize references for planning, interpreting and reporting research

The three pieces work together



Process for entering citations

1. Online search (PubMed)
2. Import
3. Export (Web of Science)
4. Manual entry

EndNote Demo

Zotero



- Free Firefox plugin (www.zotero.org)
- **Collect, manage, and cite** your research sources directly from the Web
- Libraries and sub-collections
- Multiple citation styles (16)
- Formatted bibliographies
 - Drag and Drop formatted citations to the reference list in your paper as you write
- Exports references into EndNote
