Many enhancements have been made to the digital library, including the Walsh & Hoyt Clinical Neuro-Ophthalmology Textbook, the NANOS Annual Meeting and the archives of the Journal of Neuro-Ophthalmology. These new collections will be highlighted. Following the NOVEL update, the latest tablet and eReader devices and applications will be reviewed. The Apple iPad and the Android Tablets will be demonstrated, covering useful applications on each. A variety of eReaders will be reviewed, including the Kindle, nook, and the tablet eReader apps. The Digital Tidbits segment will highlight tools including medical and neuro-opthalmology apps, gadgets, media, and web sites. Google Plus and Google Sites, free web-based collaborative workspace tools, will be demonstrated. NOVEL help and EndNote consultations will be available at the NOVEL table outside the main lecture hall throughout the meeting.
